Christ brought me to Him just like most of us, broken and lost. It was about 30 years ago. No one shared the gospel with me, I mean, intentionally. Where I used to work, back then, the owner had just become a believer, and he would always give us different training courses like oratory, sales techniques, human relations, etc.

As part of our compensation, he would do exams or quizzes after each training, so if we passed with a minimum of 85%, we would get 25% more of our regular compensation.

After a while, he ran out of options for training, so he started a class including reading and bible discussions just in a very casual way, and the same quiz options for the compensation took place. Nobody was obligated to attend the Bible option because it is against the law to force spiritual teachings at work, but obviously, everyone would go because of the extra payment. I was one of them.

Since the very first page of the Gospel of John, I started to feel something “weird” in me, and after a few months going through the Gospel of John, verse by verse, one day I completely broke down and asked God for forgiveness in my room just by myself. I was living by myself back then. I did not know what to do or what to say; I just knew that unless I surrendered to Christ, I was lost. One of my co-workers was a Christian evangelical believer, so in a few weeks after I asked God to forgive me, I met with him and asked him what was needed to be done to follow Jesus, he lead me into the repentance prayer and gave me a few instructions and the after that I have tried to obey Christ in everything he’s asked me.



After like 6 months following Jesus and meeting at a local church, there was this Indian Missionary who came to visit our church. At the end of his sermon, he invited to the front those whom God had put a calling in their hearts for missionary work.

He said he wanted to pray for those being called. I was one of them, but was so afraid and scared, and did not know what was happening. I felt “something” like almost lifting me off my chair, but I was afraid and scared, I held down to my chair with all of my strength and fought it off. The preacher insisted a few times, saying that there was one more person God was calling to missions, and that he had to respond. I was afraid because of what was going on in my heart, but I did not stand and went to the front.

I had this feeling of guilt for years, knowing I had disobeyed God until 2010. God confronted me and broke me down until I had nowhere to run. I have been a missionary ever since. Never have I felt closer to God and complete.

Best thing that ever happened to me. All glory to God!
